Reported by Mr. BAYARD with amendments, viz: Strike out the part within [brackets,] and insert the words printed in italics.

AN ACT

To punish and prevent the practice of polygamy in the Territories of the United States, and other places, and disapproving and annulling certain acts of the legislative assembly of the Territory of Utah.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 [That if any person or persons being married, shall, during
- 4 the life of the former husband or wife, marry another person
- 5 in any Territory of the United States, or other place, except
- 6 the District of Columbia, over which the United States
- 7 possess exclusive jurisdiction, or, if the marriage with such
- 8 other person take place elsewhere, shall thereafter live or
- 9 cohabit with such other person in such Territory, or other
- 10 place, over which the United States possess exclusive juris-

diction, the former husband or wife being alive, he, she, or 11 they so offending, shall, on conviction thereof, pay a fine 12not exceeding five hundred dollars, and be imprisoned not 1314less than two years nor more than five years: Provided, 15nevertheless, That this section, or anything therein contained, 16shall not extend to any person or persons whose husband 17 or wife shall absent him or herself, one from the other, for 18 the space of five years, the one of them not knowing the 19other to be living within that time, nor to any person or 20persons who shall be, at the time of such marriage, divorced 21by competent authority, or to any person or persons whose 22former marriage, by sentence of competent authority, shall 23have been declared void.] 3That every person having a husband or wife living, who shall 4 marry any other person, whether married or single, in a Territory of the United States, or other place over which the 5 United States have exclusive jurisdiction, shall, except in the 6 cases specified in the proviso to this section, be adjudged 7 guilty of bigamy, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars, and by imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years: Provided, 10 nevertheless, That this section shall not extend to any person 11 by reason of any former marriage, whose husband or wife, 13 by such marriage, shall have been absent for five successive

years, without being known to such person, within that time

to be living; nor to any person by reason of any former marriage, which shall have been dissolved by the decree of a competent court; nor to any person, by reason of any former marriage, which shall have been annulled or pronounced void by the sentence or decree of a competent court, on the ground of the nullity of the marriage contract.

1 Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That the following $\mathbf{2}$ ordinance of the provisional government of the State of 3Deseret, so called, namely: "An ordinance incorporating 4 the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints," passed $\mathbf{5}$ February eight, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-one, 6 and adopted, re-enacted, and made valid by the governor 7 and legislative assembly of the Territory of Utah, by an act 8 passed January nineteen, in the year eighteen hundred and 9fifty-five, entitled "An act in relation to the compilation and revision of the laws and resolutions in force in 10 Utah Territory, their publication, and distribution," and all 11other acts and parts of acts heretofore passed by the said 12 legislative assembly of the Territory of Utah, which estab-13 lish, support, maintain, shield, or countenance polygamy, 14 be, and the same hereby are, disapproved and annulled: 15 Provided, That this act shall be so limited and construed 16 as not to affect or interfere with the right of property legally 17 acquired under the ordinance heretofore mentioned, nor 18

with the right "to worship God according to the dictates

of conscience," but only to annul all acts and laws which establish, maintain, protect, or countenance the practice of polygamy, evasively called spiritual marriage, however disguised by legal or ecclesiastical solemnities, sacraments, ceremonies, consecrations, or other contrivances.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That it shall not be 1 lawful for any corporation or association for religious or 2charitable purposes, to acquire or hold real estate in any 3 Territory of the United States during the existence of the 4 territorial government, of a greater value than one hundred 5 6 thousand dollars, and all real estate acquired, or held by any 7 such corporation or association contrary to the provisions of this act, shall be forfeited and escheat to the United States: 8 9 Provided, That existing vested rights in real estate shall not be impaired by the provisions of this section. 10
